

#### **Electives orientations**


Students are oriented with subject requirements for high school graduation, expectations as per the Ministry of education guidelines, College Board, and implication of selection of electives

## Career and University Guidance Counselor

### Roles

- h. Coordinating Career Week for the entire school.
- i. Supporting the school Clubs.
- j. Organizing Career Workshops with external agencies.

- I. Coordinating the Alumni Association.
- m. Tracking ADEK UPCG Rize membership
- n. Maintaining log of university applications and destinations.



## Inclusive Career Guidance program

#### **ACADEMIC DEPARTMENTS**

### **CAREER CENTRE**
